

1 Safety Instructions

This section includes the safety instructions that will help prevent personal injury or material damage risks.

Our company cannot be held responsible for the damages that might occur due to failure to observe these instructions.

- Always let the authorized service perform installation and repair works.
- Use only the original spare parts and accessories.
- Do not repair or replace any part of the product unless specified expressly in the user manual.
- Do not perform any modifications on the product.

1.1 Intended Use

- This appliance is designed for use in dry rooms.
- Use the product with the supplied stand or a suitable VESA bracket.
- The product is primarily intended for the playback of TV programs, streaming content and music/video material from external devices. Any other use is strictly prohibited.
- It is not intended as an information display or for predominant use as a computer monitor. If a still image or a nonfull-format image is displayed for an extended period, visible traces may remain on the screen for some time. This is not a defect that can be used as the basis for a warranty claim.

1.2 Electrical Safety

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUC-TIONS. KEEP THESE INSTRUC-TIONS FOR FUTURE REFERENCE. Immediately followed by: Read all security warnings, instructions, illustrations and specifications provided with this appliance.

- The product shall not be plugged into the outlet during installation, maintenance, cleaning, repair, and transportation operations.
- Standby LED is off when the mains plug is disconnected. If the Standby LED is lit then it means that your product is connected to the mains.
- Do not dismantle the product. Security risks may arise and also the guarantee of the product can become void if the television is dismantled.
- The product can only be operated with the power cord or the AC/DC adapter supplied with the product.
- Do not operate the product with a damaged power cord/AC/DC adaptor (if supplied).
- If the plug on the product has an earthing contact, only insert the plug into a socket with an earthing contact.
- Only plug the product into the mains socket after you have connected the external devices and the antenna.
- If the power the cord is damaged, it shall be replaced by authorized service only to avoid any risk that may occur.
- Do not jam the power cord under and behind the product. Do not put a heavy object on the power cord.
- The power cord should not be bent, crushed, and come into contact with any heat source.
- Never use an extension cord or a multi socket to operate your appliance.
- The product shall not be supplied with an external switching device such as a timer or it shall not be connect it to a circuit that is regularly turned on and off by a device.
- The plug of the product shall be in an easily accessible place. If this is not possible, there should be a mechanism (fuse, switch, switch, etc.) on the electrical installation to which the product is connec-

ted, in compliance with the electrical regulations and separating all poles from the network.

- Do not touch the plug of the product with wet hands.
- Do not unplug the product by holding the cable, hold the plug to unplug the product.

1.3 Fire Safety



To prevent the spread of fire, keep candles or other open flames away from this product at all times

- Do not cover the ventilation slots on the product.
- Always unplug the power plug and antenna plug during lightning and thunderstorm.
- Keep candles or other open flames away from the TV set.
- Do not expose the batteries to extreme heat such as sunlight, fire or the like.
- Only use batteries of the same type (brand, size, properties). Do not use used and new batteries together.
- Protect the product from moisture. Do not place any vessels filled with water (such as vases) on the product.

1.4 Transportation Safety

- Unplug the product before transportation.
- Disconnect antenna cable and other external devices connected to the product.
- Keep the product in its original packaging if it is available, or wrap it in bubble wrap or thick cardboard if the original packaging is not available.
- Take required precautions against falling and tipping of the product. Do not bump or drop the product while carrying it.

1.5 Installation Safety

- Do not install the product on an unstable surface. Otherwise, the TV may fall, causing serious injury and death.
- Ensure that the furniture you will place the product can safely support the TV set.
- Make sure that the edges of the product does not protrude beyond the dimensions of the furniture on which it is placed.
- Do not place the product on tall furniture that has the risk of tipping over such as cabinets, sideboards, or bookcases. If you have no other choice, fix the furniture and the TV to the wall to prevent them from tipping over.
- Do not place product on fabric or other materials located between the product and furniture.
- Do not place the product next to heating units or in direct sunlight.
- To ensure adequate ventilation, maintain clearance of at least 10 cm around the product.
- Some furniture surfaces may discolor when they come in contact with rubber. To protect furniture, you can place a sheet made of glass or plastic under the stand. Do not use textile underlays or mats such as doilies.
- Consider the above mentioned warnings whenever you change the location of the product.

1.6 Safety of Children, Vulnerable Persons and Pets

- Electrical appliance are dangerous for children and pets. Children and pets must not play with or climb on the product.
- Instruct children that there is danger associated with climbing on furniture when the TV set is to be reached.
- Cleaning and user maintenance should not be performed by children unless there is someone overseeing them.

- Keep the packaging materials out of the reach of children. There is a hazard of injury and suffocation.
- Before disposing of the product, cut the power cord and render it non-functional for children's safety.

4.4.1 Enhanced Picture Settings

The "enhanced picture settings" are in principal digital image improvements however, these should be only used when necessary, when picture quality and transmission is excellent. They may improve the display with poor material, as well, but may adversely affect the display where transmission and picture quality are excellent.

Digital Noise Reduction (DNR): – This function can only be selected with digital reception sources and AV presets. It reduces any interference from artefacts (pixel blocks) from digital programmes due to MPEG compression (such as from DVB-T receivers and lower transmission rates or DVD players).

Noise Reduction (MPEG NR): – Reduces the "noise" areas by displaying the picture a bit sharper and creating a slight blur. Thus, it must be used as little as possible with good picture material.

Dynamic Contrast: – This function dynamically and optimally adjusts the contrast for the respective picture content by analysing images and then altering this depending on a change in contrast. This increase in the contrast however, may also reduce the visible brightness levels in the picture.

Micro Dimming: – Increases the level of details in dark pictures. The television divides the screen into small sections and analyses each section individually to determine the best brightness value. This ensures that more detailed pictures are obtained in dark contents.

Movie Maker Mode: – This function is automatically activated when a movie is detected. It closes the PQ blocks and displays the movie with the picture settings set by the cinematographer of the movie. The same colour temperature "Temperature", brightness is set to 200 nits for a movie theatre experience.

Skin Colour: – This function provides the most accurate skin colour by adjusting the brightness and saturation specific to the skin colour.

Film mode: - Detects and processes feature films automatically for all channel sources. This means you will always receive an optimal picture. This functions in the modes 480i, 576i and 1080i in TV playback and for other channel sources. If the Film mode is switched on for programmes without a feature film signal, minor problems such as picture freeze, defective subtitles or fine lines in the picture could occur.

Blue intensity: – This function increases the blue intensity of white and grey tones and enhances the brightness perception.

Gamma: – This setting establishes which brightness value should be displayed for which digital transmission value. Most recordings are transmitted with a gamma value of 2.2 (all Windows PCs and newer PCs with a MAC operating system work with this; older MAC systems and transmissions without a colour profile mostly operate with a gamma value of 1.8).

Game Mode: – When this function is activated, the video delay is minimized (under 33 ms) and the video delays that may be encountered while playing games is prevented, creating a better gaming experience.

Computer Mode: – This function disables all advanced picture settings and displays the image as if it is watched through a monitor.

Color Transition Improvement: – This function provides smooth colour transitions by eliminating content-related errors in colour transitions.

MEMC: – Motion stabilization eliminates judder effects in motion content, providing a smoother viewing experience.

HDMI RGB interval: – This function sets the white - black interval of the TV according to the correct values depending on the device connected through the HDMI.

Low blue light: – This function reduces the amount of blue light emitted from the LEDs, allowing more natural light to be emitted from the TV screen and reducing eye strain. **Color area:** – This function selects the colour area and displays the colours in the standard or wide scale.

Color Management System: – This function allows the brightness, contrast and tone of the colours to be adjusted separately. It is possible to adjust these settings separately for red, green, blue, magenta, black and yellow colours. With this function, advanced settings can be made in very specific contents.

11-Point White Balance Correction: – This function provides precise color temperature adjustment in different shades of grey. When content containing shades of grey is played on the screen, the red-greenblue components of the grey tones can be precisely adjusted separately with this function.

ALS (Ambient Light Sensor) – This function continuously monitors the ambient light level in the environment through the light sensor embedded in the television. It adjusts the level of the backlight accordingly, automatically updating the screen's brightness level. In well-lit surroundings, it increases brightness, while in darker environments, it decreases brightness to provide the user with an enhanced viewing experience.

6.8 Automatic shut down when no signal

Select the time when the TV will switch off automatically if it does not receive any broadcast signals.

- From the Advanced Options menu, select Automatic Shut Down when no signal and press the .
- 2. Select the turn off time and press the ●.
- 3. Press Ġ or 🖨 to return to the broadcast.

6.9 Default Channel

Select the default channel that the TV will turn on.

- From the Advanced Options menu, select Default Channel and press the

 .
- Select Select Mode option, and press the ●.
- 3. Select Final State or User Preference.

Note:

- User's Choice when the Show Channels is selected, the default channel shall be selected from.
- 4. Press 🕞 or 📮 to return to the broadcast.

6.10 BISS Key

Biss key is an encryption technique. You can watch a frequency encrypted with the Biss key by entering the Biss key.

Note:

- BISS Key is displayed in the menu only when the broadcast source is selected as Satellite.
- From the Advanced Options menu, select ▲/▼ BISS Key and press the ●.
- 2. Press the **•** to add a Biss key.
- Use the ▲/▼ to select Frequency and press the ●.
- Use ①...① to enter the frequency for which you will enter the Biss key, select the ✓ key from the virtual keyboard and press the ●.
- 5. Use the ▲/▼ to select **Symbol Rate** (Ksym/s) and press the ●.
- Use ●...● to enter the symbol rate of the frequency for which you will enter the Biss key, select the ✓ key from the virtual keyboard and press the ●.
- Use the ▲/▼ to select Polarization and press the ●.

- Use the ▲/▼ to select the polarization of the frequency for which you will enter the biss key with and press the ●.
- Use the ▲/▼ to select Programme ID and press the ●.
- 10.Use **①**...**②** to enter the programme ID of the frequency for which you will enter the Biss key, select the ✓ key from the virtual keyboard and press the **●**.
- 11.Use the \blacktriangle/\lor to select **CW Key** and press the \bigcirc .
- 12.Use **1**...**0** to enter the Biss key, select the ✓ key from the virtual keyboard and press the **●**.
- 13.Use the ▲/▼ to select **Save Key** and press the ●.

Note:

- The BISS Key can be entered for more than one frequency. Repeat steps 2 to 13 to add Biss keys to different frequencies.
- 14. Press the 🗢 to return to the previous menu or press the 🗭 to return to the broadcast.

6.11 TKGS Settings

Note:

- TKGS Settings are displayed on the menu only when the Channel Setup is selected as **Satellite (Operator Mode)**.
- From the Advanced Options menu, select ▲/▼ TKGS and press the ●.
- ⇒ **TKGS Setting** menu will be displayed.

6.11.1 Operation Mode

• More than one frequency may be entered for the TKGS Locator list. Repeat **2** to **11** add different frequencies.

6.11.3 Resetting Table Version

6.12 Signal Information

Notes:

- Signal information changes depending on the current source.
- The signal level not only depends on your receiver system, but also on the channel which is currently active. Remember this when aligning your antenna using the signal level display.
- Press the to return to the previous menu or press the to return to the broadcast.

6.13 Open Source Licenses

- From the Advanced Options menu, select Open source licenses and press the .
- ⇒ Open source licenses will be displayed.
- 2. View the licenses with \blacktriangle/∇ .
- 3. Press 🕞 or 📮 to return to the broadcast.

7 Electronic TV Guide

The electronic programme guide offers an overview of all programmes that will be broadcast in the next week (for digital channels only).

Press the evaluate available on the remote control on the perpendicular axis to start the electronic TV guide.

Notes:

- Not all channels provide a detailed TV guide.
- Many broadcasters supply the daily programme but no detailed descriptions.
- There are broadcasters which do not provide any information at all.
- 2. Select the channel with the \blacktriangle/∇ .

Note:

- Information about the actual programme is displayed in the selected television channel.
- Press the ► to select information on the next broadcast and press the ◄ to return to the information for the current broadcast.
- 4. Press the (red) to view the programmes of the previous day, press the (green) to view the programmes of the next day.
- Press the (blue) to filter the programmes.
- 6. Press Ġ or 🖨 to return to the broadcast.

8.1 What is HbbTV?

With its modern structure, content and high definition (HD) pictures and videos, HbbTV is a new technology where broadcast and the broadband can be used together and which permits access to interactive applic-

ations that the broadcast provides through internet. The TV must be connected to internet to receive HbbTV broadcast. When you switch to a TV channel that offers HbbTV service, the relevant message will be displayed.



8.2 Using HbbTV

When you switch to a TV programme that supports HbbTV, an info message will appear stating that HbbTV broadcast is available.

Note:

- To activate HBBTV, the HBBTV Support shall be enabled from HBBTV Settings.
- 1. Press (red) to open HbbTV.
 - ⇒ Information regarding the service will appear on the screen. Additionally, coloured buttons necessary for browsing the menus will also appear.

Notes:

- The range of subjects and selection of individual subjects are subject to the programme provider.
- Numeric buttons between **1** and **0** are used for additional functions.

- Press (green), (yellow) or (blue) to select the desired subject field.
- In the subject field you have selected, use ◄/►/▲/▼ to select the desired option and confirm with the ●.
- 4. Press (red) to close HbbTV.

Note:

• If navigation does not work in HbbTV mode, press the 🕞 to exit the function.

8.3 Additional Functions for Video Indexes

- 1. Start playback with the D.
- 2. Pause playback with the D.
- 3. Resume playback with the **D**.
- 4. Rewind with the (4), and move fast forward with the (3).

5. Press the D for 5 Seconds to stop playback.

8.4 HBBTV Settings



Calling the subpage directly

If the selected teletext page contains subpages, the number of the selected subpage as well as the total number of pages is displayed.

10.1 Information on Recording and Playing Television Programmes

- Recording and reproducing programmes, this can only be done with digital television stations (DVB-S, DVB-T and DVB-C).
- The digital television stations (DVB-S, DVB-T and DVB-C) you are able to record and playback also depend on the broadcasting station.
- Besides recording and playing programmes, the Timeshift function can only be carried out using an external data medium (hard drive or USB stick).
- Recordings can be made with most data mediums on the market. However, we cannot guarantee operation for all data media.
- Recording can only be done on USB memory sticks and hard disks with FAT and FAT32 format.
- If you record a programme on an external data medium, you can only watch it on your television. You cannot watch this program on any other device.
- If you send your television to be repaired and hardware components need to be replaced, you might not be able to play the recordings again on the repaired television.
- Grundig isn't responsible for any loss of data stored on any external storage device.
- It is recommended to play the files saved on DTV by PVR media player.


10.2 Possible Limitations When Using an External Data Medium

- Depending on the broadcasting station, you may experience various restrictions on some functions from some television stations.
- Grundig has no influence on these restrictions.

- Recording a programme on the external data medium can be disabled by the broadcaster.
- If URI* protected! PVR function is blocked appears, then recording or time shift is restricted (one recording possible) or disabled (recording not possible) by the broadcaster.
- *URI = user rights information.
- If you record and save a programme on the archive of an external data medium, playback can be restricted. The broadcaster can allow you to see this programme one or more times but could also just make it available for a certain period of time.
- Stations from which children are protected, immediately require a PIN number before recording starts. If this authorization is not given, the recording may not start.

10.3 Connecting External Data Media

- It is advised to put the television on stand-by mode before connecting the External Data medium.
- Before disconnecting the external data medium, the television shall first be switched to standby, otherwise files can be damaged.
- There are two USB inputs on the television, namely USB1 and USB2 (HDD).
- A USB device that needs additional power (e.g. external hard drive) is connected to the **USB2 (HDD)** port.



 Plug the external hard drive to the USB2 (HDD) USB interface or plug the memory stick to the USB1 interface.

Notes:

- **USB1** USB1 port of the TV supports a current of 500 mA current according to the USB standard. Devices such as external hard drive and etc. that consume more power can only be connected to the USB2 (HDD) USB interface of the television.
- If you are using a power cord for the external hard drive that you have connected to the **USB2 (HDD)** USB interface, then the power cord of the external hard drive shall also be unplugged when the TV is turned off.
- You must not disconnect the USB Device from the TV while a file on the USB Device is being read by the TV.

10.4 USB Recording Settings

- 1. Press 🗨
- Press the and use the to select save.
- 3. Use the ► to select **Device Information** and press the ●.
- Select the external data media connected to the TV and press the ●.
 - ⇒ Device Info Setting menu will be displayed.

10.4.1 Formatting the Data Medium

Important:

- Formatting external data medium causes all data in the data medium to be permanently deleted.

- \Rightarrow A warning message will be displayed.
- Select Yes to confirm the formatting operation or select No to cancel it, and press the .
 - ⇒ When the formatting is complete, the Device Information menu is displayed.

10.4.2 Selecting Data Medium for Record/Time shift

If more than one external data medium is connected to the TV set, you can set different data media for record/time shift or assign both records to one data medium.

- In the Device Info Setting menu, use the ▲/▼ to select Set Time Shift and/ or Set PVR and press the ●.
- 2. As per the selection you have made in the **Device Information** menu, **TSHIFT**, **PVR** or **PVR/TSHIFT** is displayed.

Notes:

- You can connect two different external data media to the TV and select one as **PVR** record and the other one as **TSHIFT** record.
- Functions do not work if no external data medium is assigned for recording/time shift.

10.4.3 Data Medium Test

You can test the external data media to see if it is suitable for the required functions.

- From the Device Info Setting menu, use the ▲/▼ to select Speed Test and press the ●.
- 2. The test result of the data medium will be displayed on the screen within 10 to 60 seconds as per the volume of the drive.
- 3. Select **Exit** and press the to exit the Speed Test menu.

10.5 Turning the Time Shift Function On/off

You can turn time shift off or on with this feature.

- 1. Press the 🗨 to switch to the TV mode.
- Press the and use the to select the Save tab.
- Use the ► to select Time Shift Mode and press the ●.
 - ⇒ Time Shift Mode menu will be displayed.
- Time Shift Mode from the option On, Off use the select.
- 5. Press 🕞 to return to the broadcast.

10.6 Disk Setup the Time Shift Drive

If you are going to connect an external data medium to TV for the first time and use it for time shift, a disk setup is required.

10.6.1 Automatic Installation

1. Connect the external data medium to the USB input of TV.

Note:

- The **Time Shift Mode** shall be selected as, **On** to be able to install the Time Shift disk setup.
- 2. Press 🕥.
- ⇒ **Disk Setup** menu will be displayed.
- 3. Select Auto and press the .
 - ⇒ The external data medium is automatically configured and the Disk Setup Complete message displayed.

Notes:

- This should be done when an external data medium is first connected to the TV set or when the external data medium is formatted by the TV set.
- An external drive with a volume larger than 4 GB is required for this operation.
- Auto set-up creates 4GB of time shift space on drives below 32GB and 16GB on drives above 32GB.
- 4. Press 🗢 to return to the broadcast.

10.6.2 Manual Set-up

1. Connect the external data medium to the USB input of TV.

Note:

- The **Time Shift Mode** shall be selected as, **On** to be able to install the Time Shift disk setup.
- 2. Press 🕥.
- ⇒ **Disk Setup** menu will be displayed.
- Use the ▼ to confirm the Manual item with the ●.

 Select Format to format the data medium or select Skip to continue without formatting, and press the ●.

Important:

- It is recommended to format the data medium for better performance.
- This action will delete all data on the external data medium.
- 5. The formatting warning message will be displayed. Select Format and press the
 .
- ⇒ Formatting progress is displayed on the screen.
- When formatting is complete, select the size you want to reserve for time shift-ing according to the size of the data medium with the ▲/▼ and press the ●.
 - ⇒ The data medium is manually configured and the **Disk Setup Complete** message is displayed.
- 7. Press To return to the broadcast.

10.7 Pausing Programs with Time Shift and Continuous Recording

You can pause any programme you are watching. For instance, if the phone rings when you are watching a movie, you can pause the movie and resume it after the call without missing anything. The image of the last scene is stopped and recorded to the external data medium for time shift. With the continuous recording feature, TV records the channel you are currently watching as much as the time shift memory you create on external data media. Thus, you can rewind on the channel you are watching.

Note:

- Use an external USB disk drive for an uninterrupted Permanent Time Shift.
- 1. Press the D during the broadcast.
 - ⇒ Television picture is paused and delay time is displayed.

- 2. To continue the broadcast, press the ${f D}$.
 - ⇒ The system continues recording the broadcast while you are watching it.

Notes:

- The following functions can be used in the Time Shift mode.
- Fast rewind, press the **(a)** several times for the desired speed;
- Fast forward, press the 🕲 several times for the desired speed;
- To pause, press the D.
- 3. To stop time shift, press the \bigcirc .

10.8 Recording Programmes

You can record a TV channel. Record data are stored on external data media and these recordings are managed by the TV set.

A memory of 44 MB up to 110 MB is required for a 1 minute record.

Notes:

- Recordings can only performed on USB memory sticks and hard drives with FAT and FAT32 format.
- If the product cannot be recovered from the data playing/sharing/recording mode due to electrostatic discharge, user intervention will be required.
- If you remove the external data media during recording, then the recording is cancelled automatically and no data is recorded onto the external data media.
- Select the channel with the **1**...**0** or
 to start recording.
- 2. Press the **O** on the remote control.
- ⇒ Recording information will be displayed: Recording symbol, channel name, programme and recording time.
- ⇒ These information will disappear after a short while, the **REC** symbol and the recording time appear in the lower left corner of the screen.

10.8.1 Switching the TV to Standby During Recording

- Select the channel with the **1**...**0** or
 • to start recording.
- 2. Press the **O** on the remote control.
- 3. Press the () to switch the TV set to the standby mode.

10.8.2 Recording a Programme from the Channel List

- 1. Press the
 to open the channel list.
- Select a channel with the ▲/▼ and press the to confirm.
- 3. Press the **O** on the remote control.
 - ⇒ Recording information will be displayed: Recording symbol, channel name, programme and recording time.
 - ⇒ These information will disappear after a short while, the **REC** symbol and the recording time appear in the lower left corner of the screen.
- 4. Press **O** to stop recording.

10.9 Sleep Timer

10.9.1 Adding a Record Timer Using the Electronic Programme Guide

Electronic programme guide data can be used for recording.

- Press the mean on the perpendicular axis to open the electronic TV guide.
- Select the channel you want to add a recording timer with the ▲/▼.
- Select the programme you want to add a recording timer with the ◄/► and confirm with the ●.
 - ➡ Programme List Add menu will be displayed.
- 4. From the **Programme Type** item, select **Save**.

5. From the **Repeat Type** item, select (**Once**, **Week** or **Every Day**).

Note:

- To add a recording timer for a programme at a time interval other than the broadcast time specified in the electronic programme guide, select the Event Model item, and then select Timing Schedule.
- 6. To save the settings, press the (green).
- 7. Press 🗨 to return to the broadcast.

Notes:

- A warning is displayed before the timer recording starts and counts down for 15 seconds to allow you to switch to the channel. At the end of 15 seconds, the channel to be recorded appears automatically.
- If the timer recording starts during playback, playback stops. If you do not select Yes option in the warning prompt, recording will start automatically at the end of the countdown.
- Only for UPC customers Note: Parts of previous or next files can be included into the record while the programme is being recorded resulting from possible Programme Guide errors. In such cases, keep in mind that the highest family protection level will apply for the whole recording if one or more of those programmes have any level of family protection.

10.9.2 Adding a Record Timer By Entering the Information Manually

 ●...● and press the (green).
- 7. Select **Start Time** and press the **●**. Select hour, minute and seconds with the

1...**0** and press the **(**green).

8. Select **Stop Time** and press the **•**. Select hour, minute and seconds with the

1...**0** and press the \bigcirc (green).

- 9. Select Programme Type and press the
 ●. Use the ▲/▼ to select Save and press the (green).
- 10.Select Repeat Type and press the ●.
 Use the ▲/▼ to select (Once, Every Day or WeekWeek) and press the (green) ●.
- 11.From the Event Model item, use the
 ◄/► to select Timing Schedule and press the (green) ●.
- 12. To save the timer, press the \bigcirc (green).
- 13.Press 🗩 to return to the broadcast.

10.9.3 Editing the Recording Timer

You can delete programmed timers.

- 1. Press the \bigcirc to switch to the TV mode.
- Use the and then the ▼ to select the Save tab.
- 3. Use the ► to select **Programme List** and press the ●.
 - ⇒ The scheduled recording timers will be displayed.

- Select the recording timer you want to edit with the ▲/▼ and press the ● (red).
- 5. Edit recording timer.
- 6. To save the changes, press the (green).

10.9.4 Deleting a Recording Timer

You can delete programmed timers.

- 1. Press the 🗩 to switch to the TV mode.
- Use the and then the ▼ to select the Save tab.
- 3. Use the ► to select **Programme List** and press the ●.
- ⇒ The scheduled recording timers will be displayed.
- Select the recording timer you want to delete with the ▲/▼ and press the ● (blue).
- Use the ◄/► to select Yes order to delete the timer or select No and press the to cancel deletion.

10.10 Playback

Programmes that are recorded are stored in an external data medium. You can display the archive on the external data media from the **Recorded Files List** menu.

10.10.1 Playing a Recording from the List of Recorded Files

- Press the and use the to select the Save tab.
- 3. Use the ► to select **Recorded Files List** and press the ●.
- \Rightarrow Recorded Files List will be displayed.
- Press the ▲/▼ to select the broadcast you want to play and press the ● to start playing.
- 5. Press the 🖸 to pause playback.

6. Press the **O** to stop playback.

10.10.2 Forward/Reverse Picture Search

- Press the repeatedly during playback to select the playback speed (2x, 4x, 8x, 16x, or 32x).
 - \Rightarrow The picture is searched backwards.
- 2. Press the Prepeatedly to select the playback speed (2x, 4x, 8x, 16x, or 32x).
 - \Rightarrow The picture is searched forwards.

10.11 Deleting Broadcasts from the Recorded Files List

You can delete recorded broadcasts from the Recorded Files list.

- 1. Press the 🗨 to switch to the TV mode.
- Press the and use the to select the Save tab.
- Use the ► to select Recorded Files List and confirm with the ●.
- ⇒ **Recorded Files List** will be displayed.
- Select the recording you want to delete with the ▲/▼ and press the ● (yellow).
- 5. To confirm deleting, select **Yes** and to cancel deleting, select **No**.
- 6. Press 🕞 to return to the broadcast.

11 USB Player

11.1 File Formats

Your television can be operated via the USB input with the following file formats:

11.1.1 Video Data

Video compression / decompression (codec) is intended for decreasing the storage area without sacrificing the picture quality. Your TV set allows you to play compressed video data with XVID, H. 264/MPEG-4 AVC (L4.1, Ref. Frames: 4), MPEG-4, MPEG-2, MPEG-1, MJPEG. MOV standards.

File extensions supported by the device: ". avi", "mkv", ". mp4", ". ts", ". mov", ". mpg", ". dat", ". vob",". divx". In addition to video data, these files also contain audio data compressed and "packaged" by MP3, AAC or Dolby Digital.

Format (codec) information is embedded within the file content and may differ depending on the file extension. ". avi", ". mkv" or ". divx" files containing divx codec within are not played back.

11.1.2 Audio Data

Your television can play audio data coded with MP3, AAC standards.

MP3 indicates MPEG-1 Volume Level 3 and is based on the MPEG-1 standard that was developed by MPEG (Motion Picture Expert Group).

AAC indicates the Advanced Audio Coding and is developed by MPEG. AAC provides higher audio quality with the same data rate (bit rate).

File extensions supported by the device: ". mp3", ". mp2", ". m4a", ". aac", ". wav" MP3 files can be organized into folders and sub-folders similar to the files on a computer.

11.1.3 Picture Data

Your television can display picture data in JPEG, PNG and BMP formats.

JPEG stands for Joint Picture Experts Group. This process is intended to compress picture files.

PNG and BMP are designed to compress picture data without any losses.

Picture files can be saved on a data medium along with other file types.

Such files can be organised as folders and subfolders.


11.2 Connecting External Data Media

It is advised to put the television on standby mode before connecting the External Data medium. Connect the device and then switch the television on again.

Before disconnecting the data medium, the television must first be switched to standby, otherwise files can be damaged.

Notes:

- USB1 port of the TV supports a current of 500 mA current according to the USB standard. Devices such as external hard disk and etc. that consume more power can only be connected to the USB2 (HDD) interface of the television.
- If you are using a power cord for the external hard drive that you have connected to the **USB2 (HDD)** USB interface, then the power cord of the external hard drive shall also be unplugged when the TV is turned off.
- You must not disconnect the USB Device from the TV while a file on the USB Device is being read by the TV.
- A bi-directional data transfer as defined for ITE (Information Technology Equipment) devices in EN 55022/EN 55024 is not possible.
- USB transfer is not an operating mode in it self. It is only an additional function.



 Plug the external hard drive to the USB2 (HDD) port or plug the memory stick to the USB1 port of the TV set.

This feature must be supported by the device you connect as well.

Your television supports the following functions. For detailed information about this feature, read the user manual of the external device.

18.1.1 Switching the External Device On from the Standby Mode

If you switch your external device (e.g. DVD player) on from standby mode, your television will also be switched on from standby and switched to the HDMI source that your television is connected to.

Depending on the features of the external device (e.g. AV receiver), it may be turned on and your television may remain in standby mode.

18.1.2 Selecting the HDMI Source

When you switch on your external device (e.g. DVD player), your television will switch to the HDMI source that the external device is connected to. (Your television must be on).

18.1.3 Selecting the Menu Language

When you select the menu language of the television, the menu of the external device will change, too. (If the External Device supports it).

18.1.4 Switching the External Device to Standby Mode

After switching your television to standby, your external device will also switch to standby if it is on. For detailed information about this feature, read the user manual of the external device.



the external device's instruction manual). You can find out which values you need to set by referring to the guidelines in the section about connection options.

- Do not connect any other equipment while the device is switched on. Switch off the other equipment as well before connecting it.
- Only plug the device into the mains socket after you have connected the external device.



- Scrambled channels can only be viewed with a CA module suitable for the encoding system and the corresponding smart card.
- Your television is equipped with a Common interface slot into which CA modules from various providers can be inserted.
- You can insert the provider's smart card into the CA module in order to enable the encrypted stations you want to see.

• Your TV supports CI+1.4.

18.6.2 Inserting the CA module





19.3 Wireless Network Connection



- Your TV set is equipped with a built-in Wireless Wi-Fi Adapter to connect it to wireless network.
- Wireless LAN adapter supports IEEE 802.11B/G and N communication protocols. We recommend you to use IEEE 802.11N protocol to obtain the best performance in HD video playback over wireless connection.
- If you use a modem that supports IEEE 802.11B/G, video playback performance may be poor when compared to a modem that supports IEEE 802.11N since the data transfer rate of IEEE 802.11B/G protocol is lower.
- It is recommended to switch off the equipment that are not in use in home network in order to avoid unnecessary network traffic.
- Placing the modem or wireless network sharer on an elevated location will increase the wireless connection reception strength.
- Wireless connection reception strength may vary depending on the type of the modem and the distance between the modem and television.

19.4 Wireless Network Settings

Features described here are for informative purposes only. All features are not available on all TV models.

ARC

With ARC (Audio Return Channel) the audio signal of the television programme can be played back via a HDMI cable or an optical cable with a multi-channel amplifier.

Backlight

Manual setting for back lighting (only active if dynamic back lighting is switched to "OFF"). This setting also directly impacts power consumption.

Block Noise Reduction

This function can only be selected with digital reception sources and AV presets. It reduces any interference from artefacts (pixel blocks) from digital programmes due to MPEG compression (such as from DVB-T receivers and lower transmission rates or DVD players).

Common Interface

It is an interface used in DVB receivers. Scrambled channels can only be viewed with a CA module suitable for the encoding system and the corresponding smart card.

DiSEqC

DiSEqC (Digital Satellite Equipment Control) is a digital system that ensures that the motorized multiple-LNB satellite systems are controlled.

DiSEqC is required when two or more satellite locations need to be controlled.

DiSEqC 1.0

It is used when more than one LNB is used on an antenna and/or when different satellite signals are used by using more than one antenna. DiSEqC1.0 can support a maximum of 4 LNBs or 4 Antennas.

DiSEqC 1.1

For use in systems where multiple LNBs or antennas are used (diagonal, cascading). DiSEqC1.1 can support a maximum of 16 LNBs or 16 Antennas.

DiSEqC 1.2

Supports motorized antenna systems. Antenna motors can be controlled manually on the television.

Domain Name System

The domain name system (DNS) is one of the most important services on the Internet. Its main function is to convert an Internet address into the corresponding IP address.

DVB-C

DVB-C (Digital Video Broadcasting – Cable) is a type of DVB used for the transmission of radio and television signals through a cable connection.

DVB-S/S2

DVB-S/S2 (Digital Video Broadcasting – Satellite) broadcasts the DVB signals through the satellite.

DVB-T/T2

DVB-T/T2 (Digital Video Broadcasting – Terrestrial) is a type of DVB used for the transmission of radio and television signals through terrestrial channels.

Dynamic Backlight

Here the device optimally adjusts the back lighting for the picture content by regulating the back lighting depending on the average picture brightness. If a picture has predominately dark areas, then the black level displayed is improved by downward adjustment of the back lighting (in this case the display of the dark areas is improved), and with predominantly bright picture material the back lighting is maximised in order to display these areas more brightly.

Dynamic Contrast

This function dynamically and optimally adjusts the contrast for the respective picture content by analysing images and then altering this depending on a change in contrast. This increase in the contrast however, may also reduce the visible brightness levels in the picture.

Firmware Version

Firmware is the term used for software that is embedded in a programmed chip (microcontroller). It is mostly stored in a flash memory, an EPROM or an EEPROM. The firmware contains functions for controlling the device.

Film Mode

Detects and processes feature films automatically for all channel sources. This means that you get the optimum picture at all times.

This functions in the modes 480i, 576i and 1080i in TV playback and for other channel sources.

If the "Movie Mode" is switched on for programmes without a feature film signal, minor problems such as picture freeze, defective subtitles or fine lines in the picture could occur.

Gamma

This setting establishes which brightness value should be displayed for which digital transmission value. Most recordings are transmitted with a gamma value of 2.2 (all Windows PCs and newer PCs with a MAC operating system work with this; older MAC systems and transmissions without colour profile mostly operate with a gamma value of 1.8).

Gateway

Gateway allows networks, which may be based on completely different protocols, to communicate with each other. In the home area, a combination of the router and the DSL modem are used as an Internet gateway.

Hardware Version

Hardware in this context means the device. This includes all components such as processor, display, etc.

HbbTV

HbbTV is the interactive successor of video text, which has content with a modern design, high resolution images and video sequences as well as media libraries. For full functionality of HbbTV, the TV must be connected to the Internet.

HD / Full HD / UHD (4K)

High Definition (HD) TV is a general name for the television standard that has increased vertical, horizontal and timewise definition.

Full HD is a feature of devices with HDTV that can output or record 1920x1080 pixels of definition.

Resolution for UHD (4K) is 3840 x 2160.

HDMI CEC

This feature utilizes CEC (Consumer Electronics Control) protocol.

CEC enables external devices that are connected to the HDMI socket with the HDMI cable to be controlled via the remote control.

IP Address

An IP address (Internet protocol address) is used to uniquely identify the address of computers and other devices in an IP network. The most well-known network in which IP addresses are used is the Internet. Here, for example, web servers are addressed using the IP address. The IP address can be provided automatically by the router (automatic address) or can be entered manually in the router (static address). If it is entered manually, this address must be entered in the TV set.

JPEG

JPEG stands for Joint Picture Experts Group. It is the compressing process of picture data.

LNB

The Low Noise Block resides at the centre of parabolic antenna.

Eg. It implements the satellite frequencies that are between 10.7–11.75 or 11.8–12.75 GHz in 950 to 2150 MHz and ensures cable transmission with coaxial cables (and with fibre-optic cables recently) and reception with satellite receivers.

MP3

Compressed audio file format.

NAS (network attached storage)

The abbreviation NAS is used for devices that provide data from a hard drive to a network.

Network Mask

The network mask or net mask, sometimes also referred to as a subnet mask, is a bit mask that separates an IP address into a network part and a device/host part. It is used in IP networks to make routing decisions.

Network Name (SSID)

The network name (SSID – service set identifier) is the term used for the identification of a wireless network that is based on IEEE 802.11. Every wireless LAN has a configurable SSID, which uniquely identifies the wireless network. The character sequence of the network name can be up to 64 characters in length. It is configured in the base station (access point) of a wireless LAN and set on all clients which access it.

Noise Reduction

Reduces the "snow" areas by displaying the picture a bit sharper and creating a slight blur. Thus, it must be used as little as possible with good picture material.

Perfect Clear

Improves the general image by means of a gentle blue hue (giving the appearance of greater sharpness) and increases the black level by setting this entirely to black from a specific level of black hue. This reduces the visible grey values in the dark areas of the picture.

Proxy Server

A proxy or proxy server is a service programme for computer networks that administers data transfer. It makes data transfer faster, and can also increase security by implementing access control mechanisms. The transfer is conducted between computers or programmes in computer networks. On the server side, the proxy acts as a client; on the client side, it acts as a server.

Router

A router is a network component that links several computer networks. Router analyses (on the basis of layer 3 information) the network packages of a protocol it receives and forwards it to the intended destination network. Conventional routers work on layer 3 of the application layer. A router has an interface for every network connected to it. When data is received, the router determines the correct path to the destination and thereby the suitable interface via which the data can be transferred. For this it uses a locally available routing table that specifies via which router connection a particular network can be reached.

SCR (Single Channel Router)

Single Cable System EN 50494.

If your antenna system is equipped with a single cable system multi switch, the televisions which are connected to this antennae system can receive television programmes independently from one another.

Security (WEP/WPA)

WEP (wired equivalent privacy) is the standard encryption algorithm for WLAN. It controls both access to the network as well as ensuring the confidentiality and integrity of data. This procedure is considered insecure nowadays. For this reason, recent WLAN installations should use the more secure WPA encryption.

Special IP Address

Private IP addresses belong to the particular IP address ranges that are not routed in the Internet. They can be used by anybody for private networks, such as LANs. Many computer networks require complete connectivity at IP level, but only limited access to the Internet. If such a computer network has a private IP address range, it forms an Intranet which cannot be accessed from the Internet as the Internet routers ignore private address ranges. A gateway or router that is placed in this private network and which has a public address in the Internet as well as a private IP address makes the connection to the Internet. This can be performed by a proxy or using NAT/PAT/ masking. As the address range used can only be viewed within the private network. the same range can also be used in other private networks. The unique nature of an IP address required by the Internet protocol is ensured by this restricted visibility.

Symbol Rate

It is the amount of the symbols transmitted in a unit of time in the digital transmission technology.

Transponder

It is a cluster of various transmitters in a frequency.

Vibrant Colour

Improves colour contrast and contrast setting. This setting is mostly too strong for use with normal pictures and should only be used where necessary (low or off) otherwise nuances in the image can be suppressed.

Wi-Fi

Wireless transmission of Internet and Intranet packets.

WMA

These formats enable recording and playback of audio files which sound as good as a CD, yet only occupy a fraction of the storage space.

Shades, reflections and/or freezing on the image.

- Channel Tuning >>> Perform automatic or manual channel tuning.

- Color density at minimum >>> Increase color setting.


